BLACK MOUNTAIN

Members will be deeply concerned at the proposal for the installation of a major T.V. complex (with restaurant!) for the P.M.G. department on top of Black Mountain. No doubt you will have followed the publicity in the press with interest and been heartened by the support given by the general public to the opposition to the tower.

Now that Black Mountain, after ten years, has been created a nature reserve, it is most gratifying that Canberra people appreciate its value as a natural reserve in the city environment and are prepared to oppose the despoilation of its naturalness.

Your committee has lodged the Association's objection to the tower with the Minister for the Interior and has given support to Senator Mulvihill's suggestion for a public hearing. Any pressure, public or private, which members can bring to bear against the construction of this tower on Black Mountain will be of considerable value.

Mt. Ainslie: The N.C.D.C. have advised that it is proposed to landscape the whole of the disturbed area around the loop road and the summit of Mt. Ainslie. The planting will be predominately native trees and shrubs and it is proposed to provide additional seating, drinking fountains and rubbish bins to the area.

Camping and Field Trip Etiquette

- 1. Always leave gates as you find them. Make sure the last man knows whether to close or leave it open.
- 2. Don't drink water if there is any doubt about it. Boil it first.
- 3. Burn, bash and bury all tins except aluminium tins which you take home with the bottles. Burn and bury all food scraps. If unable to bury rubbish e.g. in the high country take it home.
- 4. Where no toilet facilities are available, cover all refuse.
- 5. Don't deliberately dislodge rocks on, or roll them over, cliff edges. Someone may be below. Treat cliff edges with caution at all times.
- 6. If a rock or sizeable stone is accidentally dislodged, call "ROCK" immediately.
- 7. Get through rather than over fences. If impossible to climb through, climb over at a post.
- 8. In scrub, walk a few paces behind the one in front of you. It is the business of the second to avoid the springing twigs, not of the first to hold them back.
- 9. Always consider the feelings and comfort of other people; avoid making undue noise, particularly late at night or early in the morning.
- 10. Don't build fires too close to tents as sparks burn holes.
- 11. Always make sure your fire is out when leaving camp. Use earth or water or both.
- 12. Replenish the wood supply if you use any at recognised camping spots.
- 13. Clean a campsite before you depart. Leave it as tidy as you would wish to find it.
- 14. Carry matches at all times and make sure they are dry.

MEET: Reception centre at Waist Point at 10.30 a.m. on Saturday. Allow $2\frac{1}{4}$ to $2\frac{1}{2}$ hours for the

ACCOMODATION: By the kind permission of the Canberra Alpine Club, this will be at the Club's Lodge at Perisher Valley. The numbers which can be accomodated are limited so early applications will be given preference. A charge of \$2.00 per head per night for adults, and \$1.00 for juniors (under 17 years). Club members pay their usual fee.

TRIPS: The main trip will be on Sunday from Rawson's Pass to Carruthers Peak with a choice of return via Mt. Twynam and Headley Tarn to Charlotte Pass or the shorter route via Blue Lake.

Saturday afternoon Spencers Creek will be followed down to its junction with the Snowy River.

Monday morning if there is enough energy left, we may climb Back Perisher or Mt. Stillwell.

It is hoped there will be a show of flowers to equal last season. However, there is a heavy late snow cover so flowerings may be a

Map and General Information:

A copy of the Snowy Mountains Authority General Map of Kosciusco or the National Park General Map (available at the reception centre) will add interest to your visit. Members who have a copy of the "Snowy Mountains Walks" issued by the Geehi Club, should bring it. It covers geology, wildlife, climate and history of the area. Another useful reference is "Australian Alpine Life" by John Child. One of the best references for flowers is Nuri Mass's small booklet "Flowers of the Snowlands" (taken from her Australian Wildflower Magic). Flowers and Plants of Victoria, by Cochrane, Furhe Rotherbam and Willis is
